

Bursary scheme for Higher Education students



Full-time Higher Education students * at Amersham & Wycombe College can receive a Bursary payment of up to £500 for each year of their course.

This Bursary does not have to be repaid – it is not a student loan.

It can be spent on whatever you like, but it is designed to support – and reward - your progress on your course.

Frequently asked questions

What is a bursary?

A bursary is money given to students to help them with their studies.

It is the same as a student loan?

No – the bursary does not have to be paid back.

Which students are eligible?

The Amersham & Wycombe College Bursary is available to students on higher education programmes at both the Amersham & Flackwell Heath Campuses.

Are some students not eligible?

Yes – International students are not eligible.

How much can I get?

At least £320 and a maximum of £500 for each year of study.

How and when will I get it?

You will have to pay ALL your fees by 30th November, or have received a confirmation letter from the Student Loan Company that your fees will be paid.

For each year of your studies you will get £320 at the end of February if you are still enrolled.

At the end of June you will receive a further £180 if your average course attendance on register is higher than 80% and you have completed all your course work.

Can I get a loan as well?

The bursary is in addition to a student loan.
